# Pastor's Corner

"A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots."

Isaiah 11:1

In our lives the stories so often feel like stumps. Cut off from possibility. Left to die with no hope, no promise, no growth. Whether it's financial collapse, the loss of a job or relationship, or the burdens of factors outside our own control. Our lives are filled with these places where destruction and desperation can surround us and consume us.

The place of the stump is a place where we often get stuck and we're left in a place of hopelessness. What good could possibly come from a stump that has been sawn off? Where do we turn when all that is left is roots and a barren flat surface?

God.

The one who has created out of nothing, who brought out the nation of Israel from slavery and hopelessness, who sent his Son to bring hope to a hopeless world. It's only in God that we can find new life out of the depths and darkness that our lives so often carry us to.

As we step closer towards Christmas we're going to be spending a few weeks hearing the words of the prophets. They're words that are spoken in judgment to a powerful people who have lost sight of where God stands in our lives. But they are also words that are compassion to a broken people who have seen all their hope and promise stripped away. The prophets give us a glimpse of who God is, one who humbles those who exalt themselves but who also exalts those who are humbled.

While we listen to these words of the prophets this fall listen to how God is calling you. Hear the voice of the one who brings life out of the barren stumps and roots of our lives. Imagine the new life that is possible. Hope for the Savior that is to come. For the God who brought life out of the broken places of a scattered Israel is also able to bring new life out of you.

# **Building Design Taskforce**

At its October 8 meeting, the Dilworth Lutheran Church Council appointed a Building Design Taskforce. The task force's goal is to present building solutions for our ministry needs. Ministry needs this taskforce will address include roof repair, meeting the needs of our current worship and learning ministries, and HVAC. They will work with contractors and/or architects and will present solutions for our ministry needs to our congregation. Please pray for this small group as they seek to help us best follow Jesus here at Dilworth Lutheran Church.

This taskforce comes from nearly two years of work in the congregation, beginning in April 2018, when at an all-congregation retreat, people began naming significant building needs. The timeline on page 2 shows significant work which went into appointing this taskforce:

#### **April 2018:**

At our All-Congregation Ministry Goal retreat, congregation members named over seventy-five ministry areas where they believe that God is calling us to serve. These include youth and family ministry, inspiring worship for people of all ages, handicap accessibility and caring for our building and church campus.

## October/November 2018:

A small group of Dilworth Lutheran people, our Vision Committee, condenses the work of the All-Congregation Goal Retreat into three goals, 1) grow faith in children and youth, 2) grow faith in people of all ages in worship and service, 3) best use our building for serving Christ here in Dilworth, including retiring mortgage debt.

#### November 2018:

At the Fall Congregational Meeting, Wednesday and Sunday School leaders share that they are quickly running out of space, with over two hundred boys and girls registered for our learning ministries! Congregation members spend time in small groups considering solutions and praying for God's guidance on our ministries.

## April/May 2019:

Members of the Church Council Executive Team and pastors interview over a dozen small groups in the church in determining ministry priorities, particularly in regard to the building.

## July, 2019:

A small group of Dilworth people challenges the congregation to match their \$40,000 donation to pay off our existing mortgage.


#### **August 2019:**

The Long-Range Planning Committee organizes congregational responses regarding our mission and our building and shares building needs with the Church Council.

### October 2019:

The Church Council appoints a Building Design Taskforce to come up with a plan for using our building to best meet our mission of making Christ known. Committees submitted names for consideration to this task force.

### **News from the Council**

#### **Budget 2020 and Building Design Taskforce**

The Church Council received reports from all committees at its October meeting. Ministries this fall are off to a strong start. In addition to regular business, the council received the first draft of a 2020 budget. This budget reflects our current ministry goals of 1) growing faith in children and youth, 2) growing faith in people of all ages in worship and services, and 3) stewarding our building and resources carefully, giving special attention to paying off existing debt.

The Church Council appointed a Building Design Taskforce. This taskforce has been tasked with 1) taking ideas shared by the congregation in the spring of 2019 during interviews, and sharing them with contractors/architects who can address our building needs 2) coming up with long-term solutions for roof issues, 3) finding a financially responsible plan to address our building needs.
